Shashwati's musical dexterity marks a refined eclecticism that has lent her an individualistic style at a fairly young age. Born into a family devoted to music, she is grand-daughter of the late Pt. Balabhau Umdekar, the erudite exponent of the Gwalior style of classical Hindustani music and a court musician of the Gwalior State, and initially trained under her mother Smt. Kamal Mandal.

A foremost disciple of veteran musician Pt. Balasaheb Poonchwale, under his tutelage Shashwati has acquired an able hold on the subtle complexity of 'Tappa' and 'Khyal'. Shashwati also studied under the expert guidance of Pt. Madup Mudgal, vidushi Smt Purnima Choudary and Gundecha Brothers.



Carnatic music is renowned for its heavy use of ornaments, referred to in South India as gamakas. These oscillations, fleeting leaps, and subtle touches give the ragas their individual character – conveying nuances of mood that could not otherwise be expressed. This lecture-demonstration will present an introduction to Carnatic gamaka and raga, demonstrated by the ethnomusicologist and violinist Lara Pearson, alongside audio-visual presentation of her research on South Indian raga performance. The left-hand technique required to produce the gamakas on the violin will be explored through video and 3D motion-capture footage, while the microtonal intervals typical of certain Carnatic ragas will also be discussed.






